Kongsberg Automotive manufactured the gear shifter stalk components for over 116,000 Kenworth and Peterbilt trucks from model years 2021-2024, which are now being recalled. The defect, an improperly crimped connector, can lead to a loss of communication between the shifter and transmission, potentially disabling the vehicle and increasing the risk of a crash. While Paccar received over 11,000 warranty claims related to the issue, no deaths or injuries have been reported. Kongsberg Automotive corrected its manufacturing process in August 2022 to prevent future defects, and dealers

Kongsberg Automotive (KA) has finalized a savings plan to cut indirect costs, expecting to yield annual savings of €15 million. This initiative will affect approximately 150 positions globally, primarily in support functions, with limited impact on its Norwegian operations. While some global locations will close, KA plans to strengthen its Kongsberg head office by recruiting for specific roles in areas like finance.
